CLUE on Circle K!"

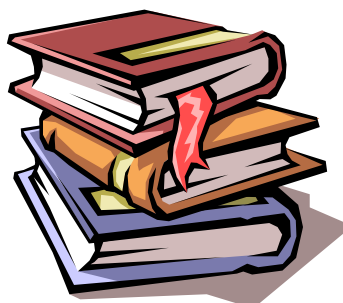
During the weekend you'll

How do we get there?

From locations south of I-64:

- Take I-81 North to I-64 W (the exit is on your left hand side).
- Take the first Lexington exit (Route 11) and take a right after you get off the highway. Go 150 yards and take a left onto Route 39.
- Stay on Route 39 for approximately 15 miles. The road is narrow and curvy! Turn right onto Route 601.
- Go down about 1.5 miles and look for signs for the Goshen Boy Scout Camp (there will be CK signs as well!) Take a right and follow the road until you see the signs for the

From all other places in the district:

- Go west on I-64 or South on I-81 to Staunton, VA.
- Go west on US-250 through Staunton then turn left on US-254 West in the direction of Craigsville. This road will become VA-42.
- Turn left on Route 39 then turn left onto Route 601. Go down about 1.5 miles and look for signs for the Goshen Boy Scout Camp.
- Take a right and follow the road until you see signs for the camp post. (Look for CK signs as well!)

Fall Training Rally is an event held every October in Goshen, VA. It has two main purposes and goals; to help inform Circle K'ers of what is going on and how to make the most of their year in Circle K; and to make sure that everyone there has fun!
